UA Campus Arboretum this Spring. The species is commonly called a Cardon and is shown on the far right of this image. The plant was salvaged from his property, transported by Old Pueblo Cactus to the UA, and installed near the Laboratory of Tree Ring Research (Bannister Building). The new plant is accompanied by a *Myrtillocactus* (also donated by Bengson) and a crested specimen of *Myrtillocactus* (donated by Lee Stanfield of Tucson).
