# Take a Stand (or have a seat) in Supporting Preservation of the Pond!



Elegant, hand forged iron, powder coated sage green, benches are are available for naming at the newly renovated Presidents' Pond (aka "Turtle Pond"). Your gift of \$20,000 funds preservation of this and other historic green spaces serving campus, community, and visitors while also providing a place to rest and recharge in this urban oasis. Your gift will be recognized with the installation of a 6' iron bench, with custom inscribed brass plaque affixed to the bench back.

### To get started, follow these 4 simple steps:

## 1. Email the Director:

Send an email to Tanya Quist: <u>tquist@arizona.edu</u> indicating an interest in bench sponsorship at the pond. Tanya will assist you in selecting from the available bench location opportunities. Once agreement is reached, payment can be made.

## 2. Send payment:

## 3. Create a custom inscription:

The inscription can be 1-3 lines long and approximately 125 characters total. Send the proposed inscription by e-mail to infoarboretum@cals.arizona.edu with **POND BENCH** in the subject line. Alternatively, mail the proposed inscription to us at the physical address provided above. Please also indicate in your letter an email address where we can communicate confirmation of your order. The director or staff member will work with you to visualize and finalize the plaque inscription to your satisfaction.

## 4. Let us do the rest:

We will order production of the bench and the plaque, coordinate delivery and installation and notify you of the completed work. Production usually takes 10-12 weeks. Your sponsorship will be recognized through the Campus Arboretum mobile tour of sponsorships so visitors can locate your tribute on campus.
