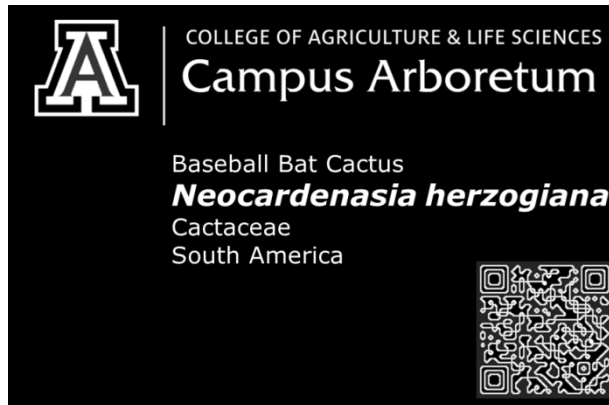


Learn More About Campus Trees With Quick Response Coded-Signs.

What is a Quick Response Code?

Throughout the University of Arizona campus grounds, you will find botanical signs containing Quick Response Codes (QR Codes). Using your smart phone, and a suitable QR Code Reader Application, you will be directed to many useful learning resources including the species description pages on the UA Campus Arboretum website.

Getting Started.

QR codes can be used in Google Android and Apple iOS devices (iPhone/iPod/iPad), as well as Microsoft's Windows Phone operating system, Google Goggles, 3rd party barcode scanners, and the Nintendo 3DS. Download the free "Scan" QR-reader for your device at: <http://scan.me/download> Open the application, and beginning scanning! It's that easy.

Helpful Tips When Scanning QR Codes:

- With the application open, point your phone or device at the QR code just as if you would in taking a photograph.
- Position the device so that the QR Code fits within the viewfinder frame on the screen.
- Hold the phone steady so that the image stays in focus.
- The Scan Application will automatically scan the code and open up a window in your internet browser.
